Adults are Akela - Adult Volunteer Opportunities

All volunteers participate in pre-camp meetings/training and a post-camp evaluation session. To volunteer or for more information, please go to the website, email the steering committee or call the hot line.

Camp Director is the administrative leader and public relations manager for camp. You ensure all operations are going smoothly, work with your staff and the District and Council's scouting professionals to ensure your camp is fun, safe and following all camp standards. During camp continue to support and guide the all volunteers. Work to resolve camp issues as needed and MC the skits and awards/recognition activity.

Program Director works with volunteers and campers to bring enthusiasm to each day! Works closely with Camp Director on all aspects of the camp program; with station hosts on a safe, fun and theme-based camp experience; with the Cub Camp Quartermaster to ensure all camp equipment is working and available; with station hosts to design activities and purchase/gather materials. Creates certificates of achievement for all ranks and presents them at the awards/recognition activity.

Health Officer maintains a daily first aid log book and the medical supplies kit and works closely with the Camp Director and Program Director to ensure the health and safety needs of all cub scouts, youth volunteers and adult volunteers are met. Conducts daily observations of each station for safety. Provide first aid and a restful / positive break area for cub scouts and parent volunteers.

Station Hosts are 2 - 4 members of one Pack that work with the Program Director to plan and lead one station's activities during the camp week. Purchase and prepare activity materials (with other Pack parents), list the accomplishments per rank for each activity, and supervise their Station Host Youth Assistant.

Shooting Sports Station Host Lead Parent is the liaison between the Range Master and the Camp Program Director. Ensure the parent volunteers are trained and prepared for each day of camp; ensure each cub scout has fun and success in the development of his skills, and supervise Boy Scout volunteers.

Den Guides are 2 - 3 parents per den per camp day who chaperone and supervise their den from activity to activity, provide a positive role model of scouting values and adult leadership, and supervise their youth Den Chief.

Pack Registrar is the liaison between the Pack and the camp leaders to register cub campers for camps and answer parent questions regarding the summer camp program.

Youth Volunteer Service and Leadership Opportunities

All youth volunteers participate in an application and interview, one or more pre-camp meetings/trainings and a post-camp evaluation session. To apply for a Youth Volunteer position or for more information, please go to the website, email the steering committee or call the hot line.



Den Chiefs are Scouts at least 14 years old. The Den Chief is a role model to cub scouts, provides leadership by assisting the adult Den Guides in the leadership and management of the den, assists the scouts during station activities and lunch, leads flag ceremony practice sessions, and is supervised by the adult Den Guides.

Station Youth Assistants are Girl and Boy Scouts at least 11 years old. The Station Youth Assistant supports the station host, helps explain and lead station activities based on the particular station and age and experience of the Scout. S/he is directly supervised by the Adult Station Hosts.
