




OCTOBER- IMAGINE THAT

TIME MACHINE OPENING

Props: "Time Machine" made from large box if space permits, if not draw on poster board to be attached to a wall, also use Cub Scout Promise Poster.

Need one adult leader or Den Chief and a Cub Scout dressed in space costume. The leader goes to "Time Machine" and turns some and the doors open as the "space boy" enters.

SPACE FLAG CEREMONY

Boys can make a simple space suit by covering moon boots and helmets with foil and wearing grey sweats or something similar. The color guard and caller dress in this costume and the color guard advances to the front of the room.

- CALLER: Color guard attention. Forward march. Will the audience please rise. Before posting the colors the head of the color guard says, "One small step for man. One giant leap for mankind." He then posts the colors.
 CALLER: Will you please join in the Pledge of Allegiance. *(Repeat the pledge)*. Color guard dismissed. The audience may be seated.




Tune: Row, Row, Row Your Boat

MAGIC TRICKS



COIN THROUGH THE NAPKIN

You cause a borrowed coin to penetrate a cloth napkin.

Borrow a coin and have the owner mark it if he wished. Hold the coin vertically by its flat side between thumb and forefinger of your left hand. Place the napkin over it so that the coin is under its center. Under cover of the napkin get a small fold of the napkin between your thumb and the coin. Now, with your right hand lift the part of the napkin closest to the audience and drape it back on top of the other half, over your left arm, and show that coin is still there. With a snap of the left wrist cause both halves of the napkin to fall forward while still holding the coin and napkin, in the center, in the left hand.

HOW IT'S DONE:

Twist the napkin to give the illusion that the coin is wrapped securely in the center of the napkin. Exert a little pressure on the edge of the coin and it will "rise through the napkin". It looks as if it is slowly penetrating the napkin. Hand the coin back to the owner and show the napkin is unharmed.

HAUNTED PAPER CLIPS

You will need 2 paper clips and a dollar bill.

Fold a dollar bill into thirds (*S shape*) and hold it in that position with two paper clips placed over each end and the center. Now pull the ends of the dollar bill in opposite directions quickly. The paper clips will jump into the air and hook together!!

THE MYSTERIOUS TEMPLE

The "magician" leaves the room while the group thinks of a number from one to five. When he returns, he walks around the group, pressing his hand to the temples of each of the players. Feeling their heads, he receives "thought waves" from them and by the time one round is complete, he can announce the number the group agreed on.

HOW IT'S DONE:

The number guessed will always be correct because he is not guessing. There will be a "spy" working with the magician. The spy clenches and unclenches his teeth while the magician is pressing his temples. If the number is 3, the spy clenches his teeth 3 times. That way, the magician receives the correct thought wave.

Feel your own temples as you clench your teeth, and you will feel the ripple. Let the boys try to figure these out..

FLOATING EGGS:

Measure 1/4 tablespoon salt into a dish and set it aside. Tell the audience that it's "Inner tube powder" which will make an egg float. Half fill a glass with water. Place an egg in it. The egg will sink. Take out the egg and stir the "inner tube powder" into the water. Place the egg in it again and the egg will float!!

SLIPPERY TRICKERY:

The boys may think it's impossible to remove an egg from a glass of water without getting wet, but let them try it. They are not allowed to use any kitchen utensil. After they have all tried, tell them that you have magic powder that will do the trick. Put a piece of thread on the cube, sprinkle salt on the cube where the thread is, and wait a couple of minutes. Astound the boys by then lifting the ice cube using the thread, from the glass of water. The salt melts the ice, and because it is just a small amount, the ice refreezes, freezing the thread onto the ice!!

BOUNCING BUTTONS

Stir a teaspoon of baking soda into a glass of water. Drop in some plastic buttons of different sizes. Pour in as much vinegar as it takes to make the buttons bounce to the top. The bubbles of carbon dioxide, which are lighter than water, lift the buttons. When they reach the surface, the carbon dioxide keeps going and the buttons drop back to the bottom to collect more. They will bounce up and down for a while. Add more vinegar to keep them going when they slow down.

THE AGE-OLD PENNY CATCH

Bend your right arm so your hand is in front of your chest. Raise your elbow so that it is level with your shoulder. Place several pennies in a pile on your elbow. Drop your elbow suddenly, move your right hand down quickly and catch the pennies before they fall.

NECKERCHIEF SLIDES

TOP HAT

Put a black circle around a 35mm film canister to make it look like a top hat. Use markers to color a match stick to look like a magic wand. Glue on the top of the hat. Make holes in the film canister and thread a pipe cleaner through so you can use it as a tie slide.



CARDS


fan out a few playing cards and glue them together (you can find miniature cards in novelty shops). Use PVC pipe as a backing.

SUN DANCE SKULL

- Materials:
- Paper mache paste
 - Newspaper strips
 - White 9" paper plate
 - Egg cartons, 2 egg sections
 - Aluminum foil
 - Tempera paint in white, black and red
 - Yarn for hanging
 - Paintbrush
 - Masking tape
 - Stapler
 - Scissors
 - Feathers
 - Scrap pieces

SUN DANCE SKULL continued

DIRECTIONS:

Cut two slits in the paper plate and staple so that the plate bends in the middle.

Tape the egg carton section on for the eye sockets.

To make the horns, shape two pieces of foil to about 8" long. Staple each horn to the back of the paper plate at the top.

Place crumpled up newspaper under the paper plate for support while you work. Cover the skull form, front and back with one layer of newspaper strips (except for the tops of the egg carton sections. Let dry overnight.

Add a second layer of newspaper strips and let dry overnight

Paint the skull with two coats of white tempera paint on the front and back. Let dry

Paint dots and stripes with red and black paint, as shown. Let paint dry.

Tie a loop of yarn to each of two feathers and hang one from each horn. To hang finished skull, staple a piece of yarn to the back.
